Scratchboard & Watercolor: Combining Drawing with Painting

- 1 - 8 x 10" scratchboard panel, pre-inked black (all boards should be Ampersand brand)
- 1 - package of 5 x 7" scratchboards (comes as package of 3) for small work and/or drawing practice
- 1 - X-acto knife and blade (No. 11 suggested)
- 1 - pad of 9 x 12" tracing paper
- 1 - pad of standard drawing paper, 8 x 10"
- 1 - roll white transfer paper
- 1- kneaded eraser
- 1 - pencil, either standard No. 2 or HB
- 1 - small roll of drafting tape (low-tac)
- 1 - standard hard ballpoint pen (with colored ink, preferably red or green)
- 1 - bottle of waterproof black ink with eyedropper top (Dr. Martin's Bombay or Pelican, or equivalent)
- 1 each of 3 Micron brand waterproof ink pens, size 02, 05, and 08
- 1 photo: 8 x 10", preferably one of your own or one you've been given permission to use (instructor will provide several photos of his own for students use, as well)

Watercolor supplies: (if you already have watercolor supplies, please bring them)

- 1 each of two synthetic brushes: #4 & #10 round (Princeton, Da Vinci, or equivalent)
- 1 small watercolor set: Winsor & Newton makes a good compact box set or ...
Tube paints (instructors preference) - Winsor & Newton or M. Graham brands recommended
- 1 each of the following small tubes (.17 fl. oz.):
 - 1) Ultramarine Blue 2) Alizarin Crimson 3) Cad Orange Medium 4) Cad Yellow Medium
 - 5) Gamboge Yellow 6) Hookers Green 7) Burnt Umber 8) Burnt Sienna 9) Payne's Gray

With individual tubes of paint you will need either a small palette with lid (Heritage makes nice ones, 5 x 10.5") or a larger plastic palette with lid (student's choice).
