

CPAC UPDATE SEPTEMBER 12, 2020

We are pleased that the 2020-2021 season is just around the corner. The State of Arizona has approved indoor theaters to operate under specific guidelines. Below is a list of protocols and policies to prepare you for your experience attending CPAC performances this year. Ongoing adjustments and decisions will be made following recommendations from state and local officials.

- The Community Performance and Art Center is a Pima County owned facility, and as such, it is a requirement for all visitors who enter the premises to wear a mask for the duration of their stay (inside or outside)
- Seating is limited to 50% theater capacity
- Concerts may be moved to the outdoor patio when weather and circumstances permit
- Intermissions and concession service will be largely eliminated this season to reduce traffic
- Patrons with seats in the center of a row are asked to be seated 10 minutes prior to curtain
- Patrons with seats on the aisle are asked to be seated 5 minutes prior to the performance
- The house will open 20 minutes prior to curtain
- Once the performance has started, patrons may move to an empty seat if it provides increased distance from surrounding guests
- CPAC staff has increased cleaning procedures following state protocols and hand sanitizer stands are now stationed throughout the building
- Please stay home if you are feeling ill, or if you have come into contact with someone who is displaying symptoms of illness
- Wash your hands frequently and practice social distancing whenever possible

*We are committed to implementing these guidelines to do our part in slowing the spread of the novel coronavirus. While we will be making our best effort to ensure a clean and safe environment, it is impossible to eliminate all risks of infection. Please consider your own individual circumstance and make the decision that is in your best interest, even if it means staying home.
